As the owner of Circuito Internazionale Napoli, I am beyond thrilled to welcome back the Rotax MAX Challenge Grand Finals to our track.

This year is incredibly special for us at Circuito Internazionale Napoli as we celebrate our 30th anniversary!

BENVENUTO IN ITALIA

And what better way to mark this milestone than by welcoming back such a prestigious event. It is an incredible honor, and this year we've made some exciting improvements to make the experience even more unforgettable. We've fine-tuned the layout of our track and added new buildings in the paddock area - upgrades that are perfectly suited for an event of this magnitude.

The Rotax MAX Challenge Grand Finals hold a special place in my heart, as they showcase some of the most dedicated and talented drivers from all around the world. Karting, in my view, is the beating heart of motorsport. It's where passion, skill, and determination are born and nurtured, and where future stars of the racing world begin their journeys. This week promises to be filled with pure passion both on and off the track, and I cannot wait to witness the competition unfold.

To all the drivers, teams, and supporters who have traveled from all corners of the globe, welcome to beautiful Italy! I look forward to an unforgettable week of racing and camaraderie.

This year, as we return to Southern Italy and the famous Sarno track in the province of Salerno and celebrate 25 years of the Rotax MAX Challenge Grand Finals 2024, we can look forward to yet another compelling edition of this amazing event.

On our third visit to the very fast and equally demanding Italian circuit close to the region's capital of Naples, under the watchful eye Mount Vesuvius in Campania, we now discover an extended track length of 1,670 metres.

The recent change to the layout finds the start-finish line repositioned on an adjacent straight and a new section that incorporates the last corner, which will definitely test the skills of the competitors. There remains ample opportunity for overtaking in the racing – the driver will make the difference!

This high profile venue has played host on numerous occasions since 1999 to a list of top-ranked international cham-

pionships that position it amongst the most well-known karting circuits on the calendar. The RMCGF was first here in 2016 after the track had just been upgraded with a new look. In 2019, the Grand Finals was back for the 20th anniversary and the global Rotax champions were honoured as the national teams met again for the season showdown to decide the distinguished class titles. Now, we are welcomed once more to the Circuito Internazionale Napoli, where more than 120 extra metres plus its 5 straights and 9 corners will challenge and inspire the contenders.

There are three main parts at Sarno to note especially, where you need to brake deeply in the approach to the turns; corner number 2, corner 8 and the last corner before the chicane leading up to the finish line. Of course, these three points are the best places where you can overtake. However, it is where you can be overtaken at the same moment. So... it's going to fun! Along the front straight, it's full speed through Turn 1 where there's a slight bump and noticeably more grip here as the rubber will go down. The first section of the track is very technical and you need to be prepared to make the chicane before the long, left corner to join the next sector at the back of the circuit.

This is very important because everything depends on the exit of the righthander at Turn 2, which tightens up on itself at the end. It's a long corner and the apex is very late. You should not be too wide at this stage, it only adds meters to the distance and is not necessary, but instead carry the speed and stay tighter to the curb. Secondly, you can pick up a lot of dust, losing direction and traction. Make it as fast as you can, stay tight and open the steering wheel before making the apex, which is late.

Then through the chicane, where it's recommended to avoid this left curb, yet take the right curb after it to prepare





well for the long left that follows. This is the initial hairpin at Turn 3 that leads into the short straight. The exit is crucial here, not riding the curb on the right and then open the steering wheel.

As you take the chicane to the left, don't go apex to apex, go wider and make the right-hand corner rounder, therefore accelerating sooner onto the back straight. It prevents the chassis from wanting to push out of the track with that momentum, so the steering is already in the right position to go straight.

In corner 5 at the end the ideal braking is very important. You really need to brake deep and slow the speed in the middle of this right corner, and as you apply the gas keep the steering wheel straight again.

Another left-right "S", staying as far right as you can to get a good approach to the 180° hairpin. This corner offers a good opportunity to overtake on the inside, but you must allow for a good THE TRACK

exit. The long, long left up next is a little bumpy, let the chassis roll, again steer straight as you prepare for the last sector of the track with the new asphalt.

This is also where the correct braking is vital. Go deep once more with the braking for turn 9, find the right apex and wait a bit before accelerating as you set up for the last chicane to make this a nice smooth run. Stay off the final two curbs and depending on the level of grip you can determine how much you apply the gas pedal.

Keep in mind the track conditions in the morning when it is cooler overnight, that

it may be slippery. If the rain arrives, the difference between the original track and the new surface of the additional section is that the newer asphalt dries slower, so you won't find as much grip there. Try to remain in the middle with a longer line and not cut too much, keeping off the rubber race line.

We can expect some quick laptimes and records to be set as the MOJO Racing Tyres are put to work. Just for example, recent testing indicated anywhere from 1:05.5 in Mini MAX, 1:01.0 in Junior MAX, one minute flat in Senior MAX and just over 59 seconds per lap in the Rotax DD2 category sessions.

RACING THROUGH YEARS: RMCGF HIGHLIGHTS

2000

RACEWAY SPEED PARK PUERTO RICO 16.-19.11.2000



66 Drivers from 19 Countries were invited to compete in Puerto Rico. The 125 Senior MAX class chassis of the drivers were shipped to Puerto Rico and prepared by the Rotax team for the race event.

2001 MORAC INTERNATIONAL KARTING CIRCUIT LANGKAWI, MALAYSIA 24.-27.01.2002



Another exotic destination: 76 drivers from 29 countries were invited to compete for the title in the 125 MAX class on their own chassis' which were shipped to Malaysia.

2002

BRIDGESTONE ZWART-KOPS KART RACEWAY PRETORIA, SOUTH AFRICA

15.-19.01.2003



The brand new kart track was built within 4 months and homologated in December 2002 to be ready to welcome the invited 68 Drivers from 33 nations. The final races were broadcasted by South African television.

A real Nightmare happened: 11 engines of the 68 showed failures and Rotax decided – together with the drivers - to get used engines from the Pretoria area, checked and sealed the engines overnight and continued the racing.



2003

GHIBLI RACEWAY SHARM EL-SHEIKH, EGYPT

The Junior MAX category was introduced and it was the first time that the chassis manufacturer was providing the chassis. The 22 Junior MAX Drivers were competing on a "single make" chassis by CRG. The 125 Senior MAX drivers raced on their private chassis. In total 90 drivers from 37 countries were invited.





2004 GRAN KARTING CLUB TRACK LANZAROTE, SPAIN 19.–22.01.2005



For the first time, all competitor raced on supplied "single make" chassis provided by CRG (125 Junior MAX category) or by BRP (for the 125 Senior MAX category). Senior MAX Drivers qualified in their categories in the RMC but raced on an RM1 with a MAX DD2 engine.

100 drivers from 39 countries travelled to the volcano island of Lanzarote.

2005

MORAC INTERNATIONAL KARTING CIRCUIT LANGKAWI, MALAYSIA 22.-26.11.2005



The 2005 Grand Finals ran three different categories: 125 Junior MAX, 125 MAX and the MAX DD2 (RM1).

The event attracted 140 drivers from 43 nations and BRP-Rotax also unveiled the newly designed MOJO tyres on this international platform.

Heavy rainfalls influenced the practice sessions.

2006

The rainy coast of Viana do Castelo, Portugal hosted the 2006 RMC Grand Finals. 186 participants from 46 countries competed in the 3 categories for the victory.
